

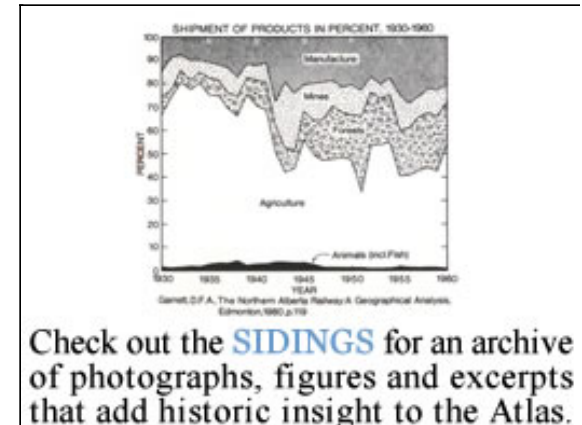
GENERAL NAVIGATION
